The Cremator

Richard Scarry's Busy, Busy World

Written between 1954 and 1957 and treating events from the Stalinist era of Czechoslovakia's postwar Communist regime, *Midway Upon the Journey of Our Life* flew in the face of the reigning aesthetic of socialist realism, an antiheroic novel informed by the literary theory of Viktor Shklovsky and constructed from episodes and lyrical sketches of the author and his neighbors' everyday life in industrial north Bohemia, set against a backdrop of historical and cultural upheaval. Meditative and speculative reflections here alternate and overlap with fragmentary accounts of Josef Jedlicka's own biography and slices of the lives of people around him, typically rendered as overheard conversations. The narrative passages range in chronology from May 1945 to the early 1950s, with sporadic leaps through time as the characters go about the business of "building a new society" and the mythology that goes with it. Due to its critical view of socialist society, *Midway* remained unpublished until 1966 when it emerged amid the easing of cultural control, but a complete version of this darkly comic novel did not appear in Czech until 1994.

The Dawn of Canadian History : A Chronicle of Aboriginal Canada

Zdenek Jirotko's famous humorous novel was first published in 1942 and since then, there have been more than 15 Czech editions. Over sixty years later, English-speaking readers can become acquainted with Jirotko's novel, whose main hero is the legendary faithful servant Saturnin, fighting with aunt Katerina and her son Milouš. The book is accompanied by original colour illustrations by the Czech painter Adolf Born.

Ancient Greek Legends

The Salamander and Other Gothic Tales contains eight stories by Vladimir Odoevsky (1804-69). These include *The Salamander*, *The Cosmorama*, and *The Sylph*, Odoevsky's three main metaphysical tales. The collection as a whole represents some of the best of Russian Romantic fiction from the first half of the nineteenth century. This is the first English edition of Odoevsky's work to be published since 1965 and six of the tales are here translated for the first time.

More Paragraphs on Translation

The collection of short stories entitled *Behind the Lines: Bulguma and Other Stories* draws on Hašek's experience from revolutionary Russia. In a manner similar to that employed in his caricatures of the pre-war monarchy, he satirically captures events of the Bolshevik revolution from the perspective of a Red commissar in a combination of grotesque humor and sarcasm. Historical events serve merely as part of the historical mystification. Hašek presents them as he perceived them as a man and participant in historical events. He depicts them primarily as simple and human, pushing his critical view into the background. On the border of a comic exaggeration and a realistic depiction, an amusing story about a forgotten Tartar town of Bugulma unfolds featuring the Soviet commander of the Tver Revolutionary Regiment, drunk Yerokhimov, and Comrade Gašek, the Commanding Officer of Bugulma. Employing humor and exaggeration, Hašek demonstrates the zealotry of the revolutionary period as well as the stupidity and simple human insecurity of authoritarians. The collection of short stories, *Behind the Lines*, also includes other sketches by Hašek, written at the same time.

Traduje se, že se Zdeněk Jirotko v případě Saturnina nechal inspirovat příběhy sluhy Jeevese, o kterém psal britský humorista Sir Pelham Grenville Wodehouse. Podobnost zde určitě existuje – mladý, bohatý a poněkud floutkovský Bertie Wooster má stejně jako Jiří Oulický distingovaného sluha, který vyniká neobyčejným intelektem, vysokou mírou vzdělanosti a nečekanými řešeními problémů svého pána. Sluha Jeeves je v Británii velmi oblíbený. P. G. Wodehouse (1881–1975) o něm v průběhu let 1915–1974 napsal 35 povídek a 11 románů, z nichž některé byly zfilmovány, objevily se v rozhlasovém zpracování nebo jako muzikály a v televizním seriálu BBC. Titul obsahuje vždy na dvojstraně anglickou verzi a český překlad. Po každém příběhu se zaměříme na zajímavý gramatický jev či slovní obrat, který následně procvičíme. Bridget Jones's Baby

Eduard Bass' story from 1922, a classic of Czech literature, has been published in

English (Karolinum 2008). The translation, distinctive for its creative and playful approach to Bass' language while being faithful to the original's style and the time of the story's conception, is a work by Ruby Hobling; the foreword was written by Mark Corner. One of the most famous works of Czech fiction, it relates the story of father Chattertooth, who brought up his eleven sons as a phenomenal soccer team. It can be read as a celebration of the spirit of fair play, tenaciousness and enthusiasm for sports as well as a slightly ironic story, making fun of the period's fascination with Czech soccer and alluding to events in the post-war society. It is no accident that the book garnered huge popularity among young and adult readers, was published more than thirty times and was put on film as early as in 1938. The English translation draws on the Czech version of Zdeněk Ziegler's design and with Jiří Grus' illustration, which won the Most Beautiful Book of Fiction Award at the Autumn Book Fair in Havlíčkův Brod in 2008.
